




What best describes your role?




It seems many students are college ready and many students graduate. Curious about career ready.

This is my first year with students at Pondo, so I'm unsure. I love all of the ROP programs offered. 95.7% graduation rate looks great.


Rate the Effectiveness of Goal #2: Teachers in the District shall be fully credentialed and provided professional development on the implementation of academic content and performance standards. ³ responses


It appears per the data, that certain sub groups are suspended more than others.


Would MTSS support all groups? Or just sub groups?




I have heard that the restrooms have been an issue. I know the districts are focusing on that piece.

Perhaps a student group would have some insight, or empathy interviews with students in these groups, could assist the work.
