

# ROP Cosmetology



## COURSE DESCRIPTION

Please note the program begins 1 week prior to the start of the school year, and ends 1 week after the last day of the school year.

Training in theoretical, practical and all phases of hair, skin and nail care, with particular emphasis on chemistry, product knowledge and life science.

Students must complete 1000 clock hours of applied effort set forth by the State Board of Cosmetology, in addition to complying with the educational standards of the Central Sierra ROP. Students will be taught the theoretical knowledge and practical skills needed to pass the California Cosmetology Examinations. In addition, students will become familiar with business practices and procedures used in most salons. In the exciting career of Cosmetology, you can become a hairstylist, platform artist, salon owner, or one of many opportunities open to licensed Cosmetologists.
